MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

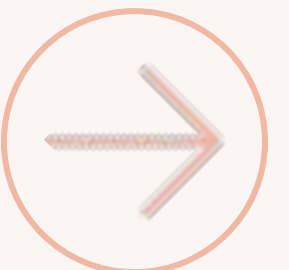
Dear Parents,

We sincerely thank our parents who have constantly supported the school in all its endeavours and look forward to the same in the future.

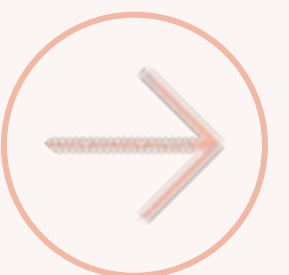


ICSE Evaluation: Where our Teachers Add Value in the Classroom and Beyond

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Yoga Day

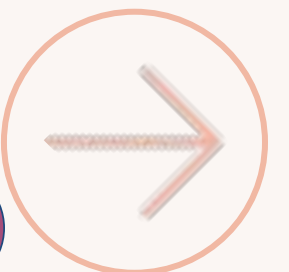

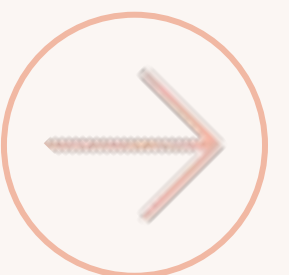

The enthusiastic participation of everyone made the event a grand success, leaving a lasting impression on all.



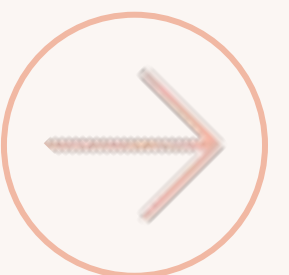

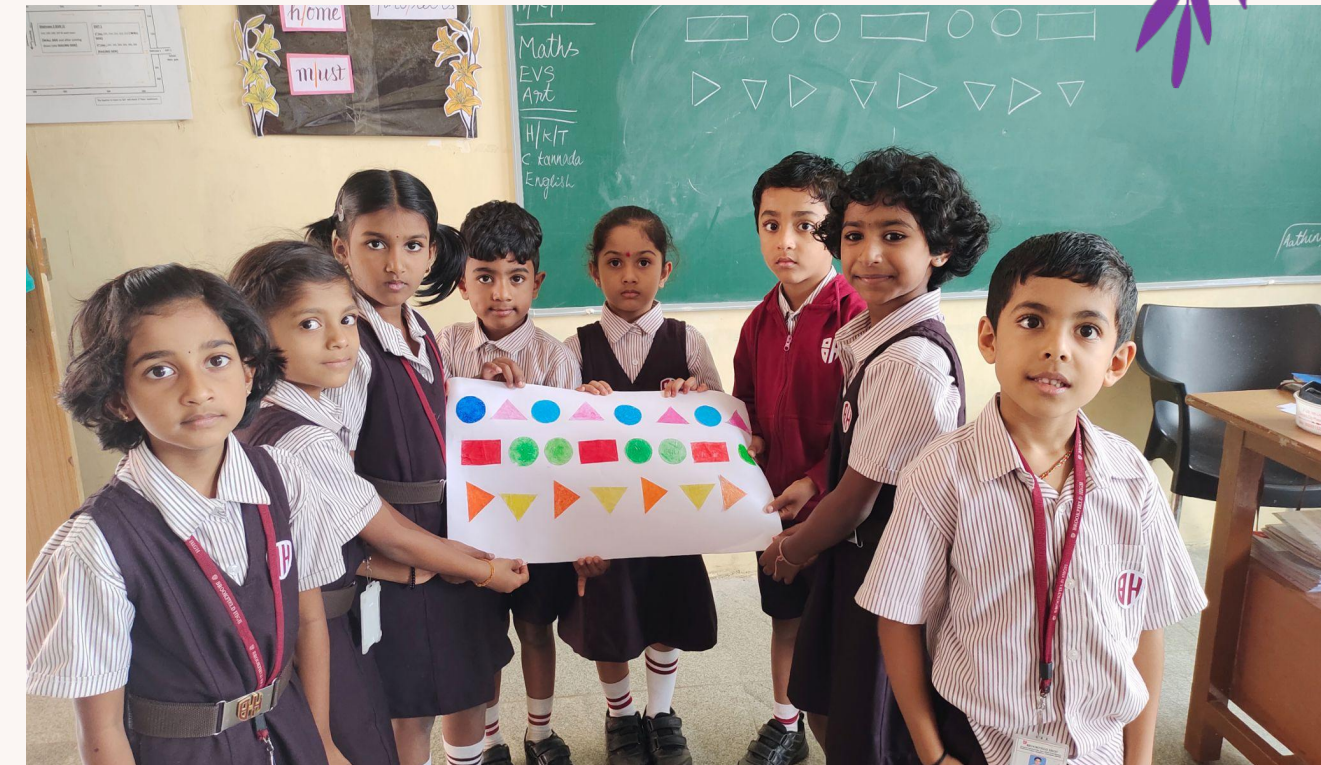

Grade 6, 7 and 9 visited the Janapada Loka and enjoyed seeing the exclusive display of the village folk arts of Karnataka.

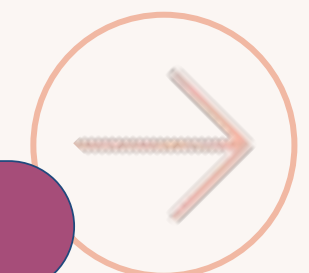

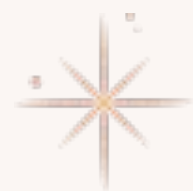

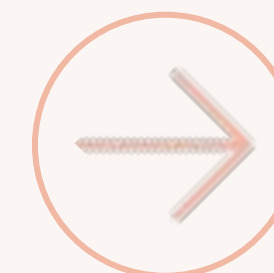

Sports Day



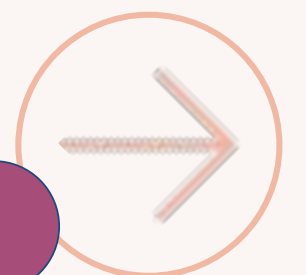

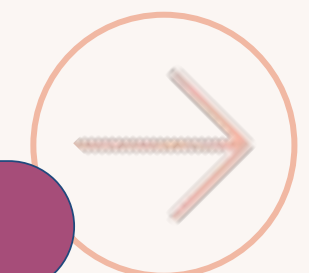

Talent Show

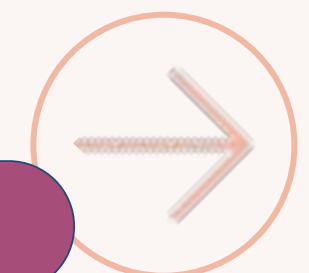

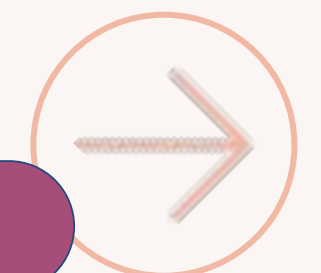


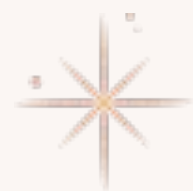

The students of Brookfield High joyfully celebrated the festival with honour & gratitude to nature and the Sun God.

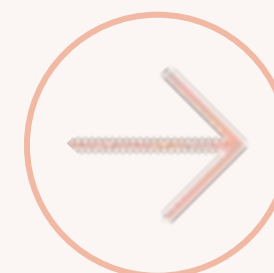
The special assembly included speeches about the importance of agriculture & showcased lively folk dance performances.

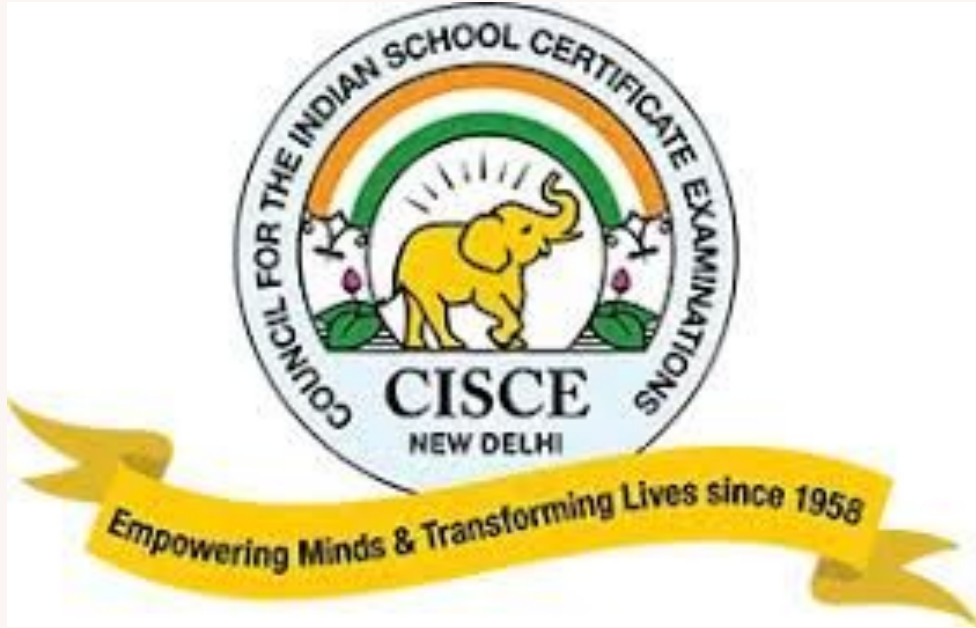
